

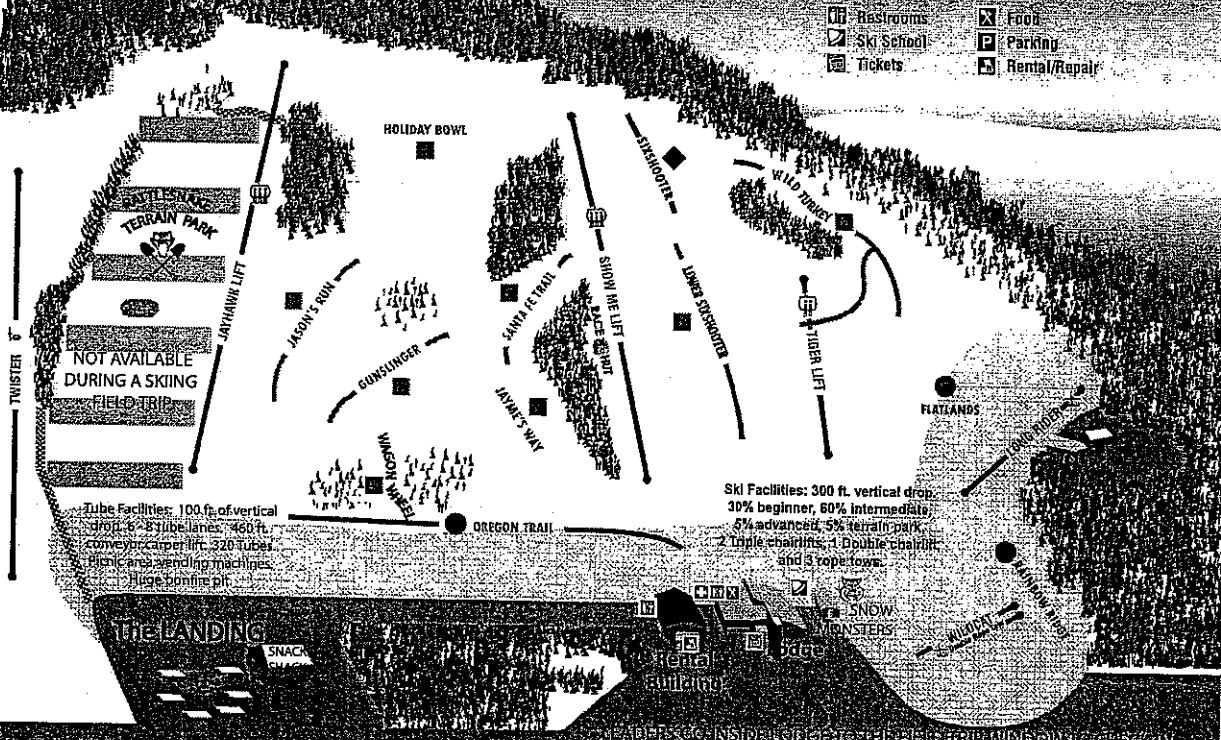

**If you sign up for a ticket upgrade, you must have experience prior to this visit - loading, riding and unloading an Intermediate Chairlift.**

Lessons are included and are available to any level skier. However, the lessons that are taught for the field trip program are the beginner refresher lesson. They do not cover using the intermediate runs or chairlifts.

**Your child should have experience loading and unloading an intermediate chairlift to classify as a Type II or Type III skier.**

**\*Classify yourself\***

**Type I**

Are Beginner/Entry level skiers. Cautious skiing on smooth slopes of gentle to moderate pitch. Skiers who designate themselves as Type I receive lower than average release/retention settings.

**Type II**

Skis on a variety of terrains at various speeds. Skiers who designate themselves as Type II will receive average release/retention settings appropriate for most recreational skiing.

**Type III**

Skis on more challenging terrains. Skiers who designate themselves as Type III receive higher than average release/retention settings.

I understand that the sport of skiing & snowboarding involves inherent danger and other risks of INJURY and DEATH! "Inherent dangers and risks of skiing" means those dangers or conditions which are an integral part of the sport of skiing, including but not limited to snow conditions as they exist or may change, collisions with natural objects or man-made structures and their components, variations in steepness or terrain, whether natural or as a result of slope design, snowmaking or grooming operations, and collisions with other skiers or boarders. I voluntarily agree to assume all risks of injury or death that may result from skiing or which relate in any way to the use of this equipment. I AGREE TO RELEASE Snow Creek, its rental shop, its employees, owners, affiliates, agents, officers, directors, and the manufacturers and distributors of this equipment (collectively "PROVIDERS"), from all liability for injury, death, property loss and damage which results from the equipment user's participation in the sport of skiing or boarding or is in any way related to the use of this equipment, including all liability which results from the NEGLIGENCE of PROVIDERS, or any other person or cause. I further agree to defend and indemnify PROVIDERS for any loss or damage, including any that results from claims or lawsuits for personal injury, death, and property loss and damage, rated in any way to the use of this equipment. This agreement is governed by the applicable laws of this state. If any provision of this agreement is determined to be unenforceable, all other provisions shall be given full force and effect, and in the event that I am signing on behalf of any minors... that I have full authority to do so... realizing its binding effect on them as well as myself.

I accept for use as is the equipment listed on this form, and accept full financial responsibility for the care of the equipment while it is in my possession. I understand that the binding system cannot guarantee the user's safety. In downhill skiing, the binding system will not release at all times or under all circumstances where release may prevent injury or death, nor is it possible to predict every situation in which it will release. In snowboarding, the binding system will not ordinarily release during use. These bindings are not designed to release as a result of forces generated during ordinary operation. If I fail to return the equipment when I am finished with it or it is damaged beyond repair, I agree to reimburse Snow Creek for the replacement value.

## Students & Chaperones Field Trip Guidelines

When field trips participants sign the rental permission form, they are agreeing to the following:

### STUDENTS:

1. While at Snow Creek Ski Area, I will behave appropriately to ensure the safety of everyone. All rules that would apply at school, apply at Snow Creek.
2. After I eat lunch, I will clean up after myself. I understand that if I am found making a mess or causing problems, I will sit with a chaperone in the lodge for the remainder of the field trip.
3. When it is time to leave, I will be responsible for RETURNING SKI EQUIPMENT to the Rental Shop Staff. I will bring it inside and wait for my ticket from the attendant. (Your school will not leave until all equipment is accounted for.)
4. Make sure you do not leave your shoes or bags unattended, other schools will be sharing the building with you.
5. You must have a lift ticket attached to get equipment.

Snow Creek works very hard to keep the cost of the program to a minimum to enable students to experience the thrill of alpine skiing. Please help to keep our facilities top notch!

### CHAPERONES: (must read, fill out, and sign the rental agreement)

The Rental Shop will not process any field trip forms after 12 noon.

1. Arrive with students at the scheduled time.
2. No Siblings or outside guest will be allowed to participate with the field trip program.
3. Your action while at Snow Creek will directly reflect on the school you are with. Please take caution to conduct yourself in the appropriate manner. Your actions could effect whether your school gets invited back in the future.
4. You must have a lift ticket to get equipment.
5. You will get your equipment after the students have theirs. You are here to help them.
6. Please be sure to go with your class to take the lesson, it is part of your job as a chaperone to be with the students.
7. Make sure all items are picked up from your school. Please do not take your items into the cafeteria, it takes up valuable space for the students to sit and eat.
8. Please make sure that all rental equipment is picked up and returned by the students or chaperones.
9. Chaperones are not allowed in the bar area.
10. When loading to leave, please do not block all the doors leading to the parking lot. You need to make sure others can get in and out of the building.
11. Make sure the busses are parked in the back of the parking lot where it is marked "bus parking" to avoid getting blocked in.

### Your Day at Snow Creek

1. Upon arrival, you will proceed to the cafeteria where you will be greeted by our ski patrol and ski school. They will go over a few brief rules and procedures with your group.
2. Next you will proceed to the Rental building. Your first stop will be the boot area. Here, the staff will assist you with finding the proper ski boot.
3. Next, you will go over to the ski counter and get your skis.
4. After you have your ski boots on, you will carry your skis out to the front patio. From here you will get in line for the station taught lessons.
5. After your lessons, you are free to ski on your own. Make sure you check with your teacher to find out when you should meet for lunch and who you should get your lunch ticket from. Your lunch ticket will get you a hot dog, plain chips, and a small drink. If you wish to get something else, you will need to purchase it.
6. Pay attention to the time. Make sure you know when you are suppose to come off of the ski slopes and get ready to go home. We will make announcements, however in some places on the hill, it is hard to hear.
7. When you come in, bring your skis back to the ski rental counter, sit down and take off your boots, and return them to the correct size boot rack. You will get a ticket when you return your boots and a ticket when you return your skis. Hold on to these and give them to your teacher before you get on the bus.

### USEFUL INFORMATION

The location of ski patrol (First Aid) is the second red door to the left on the slope side of the building.

Snow Creek Souvenir items may be purchased at the Field Trip/Group Sales' ticket windows located inside the lodge or the ticket window located outside under the red awning.

You can store shoes or extra gear in our coin operated lockers. Lockers are 50 cents each time you get into them.

A change machine is available in the Rental building.

### Your Skier Responsibility Code

1. Always stay in control and be able to stop to avoid other people or objects.
2. People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
3. You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
4. Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look up & yield to others.
5. Always use devices to prevent runaway equipment.
6. Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails & out of closed areas.
7. Prior to using any lift (rope tow or chair), you must have knowledge and ability to load, ride, and unload.
8. Foul language and/or abusive behavior is not permitted.
